

Doman takes over Popular Mechanics

Seasoned journalist and current deputy editor, Anthony Doman, will pick up the editorial reins at *Popular Mechanics* on 1 October with the retirement of founding editor, Alan Duggan, who has held the position since *Popular Mechanics* was launched locally in August 2002 - the centenary year of the eponymous American title.
