The 2017 PRISA National Conference, which was held at the Indaba Hotel from 4-5 May, was deemed to be a success by delegates. The local and international speakers that attended this event imparted their knowledge and global expertise. Dr Sooliman was honoured for his comparable humanitarian work rendered to South Africans, his country and internationally.
